

- ① Chubb Trailhead
- ② Flint Quarry Trailhead- Parking Lot/Restroom
- ③ The Picnic Table
- ④ Formerly known as the Ridge Trail the branch here now makes the Flint Quarry Trail a complete loop returning to the parking lot. Most riders consider this branch to be a one-way trail going down. The loop also makes use of part of the Chubb Trail.
- ⑤ Depending on the state of the river, you can take either the low or high water routes.
- ⑥ Again, depending on the state of the river, this part of the trail may be impassable due to high water.
- ⑦ After a rocky, rooty, technical section squeezed between the railroad tracks and the river, the trail enters a part of Castlewood State Park which is south of the Meramec River (there is no connection to the rest of Castlewood here), and continues toward the Lone Elk Trailhead.

Lone Elk County Park- Chubb Trail, Castlewood Loop



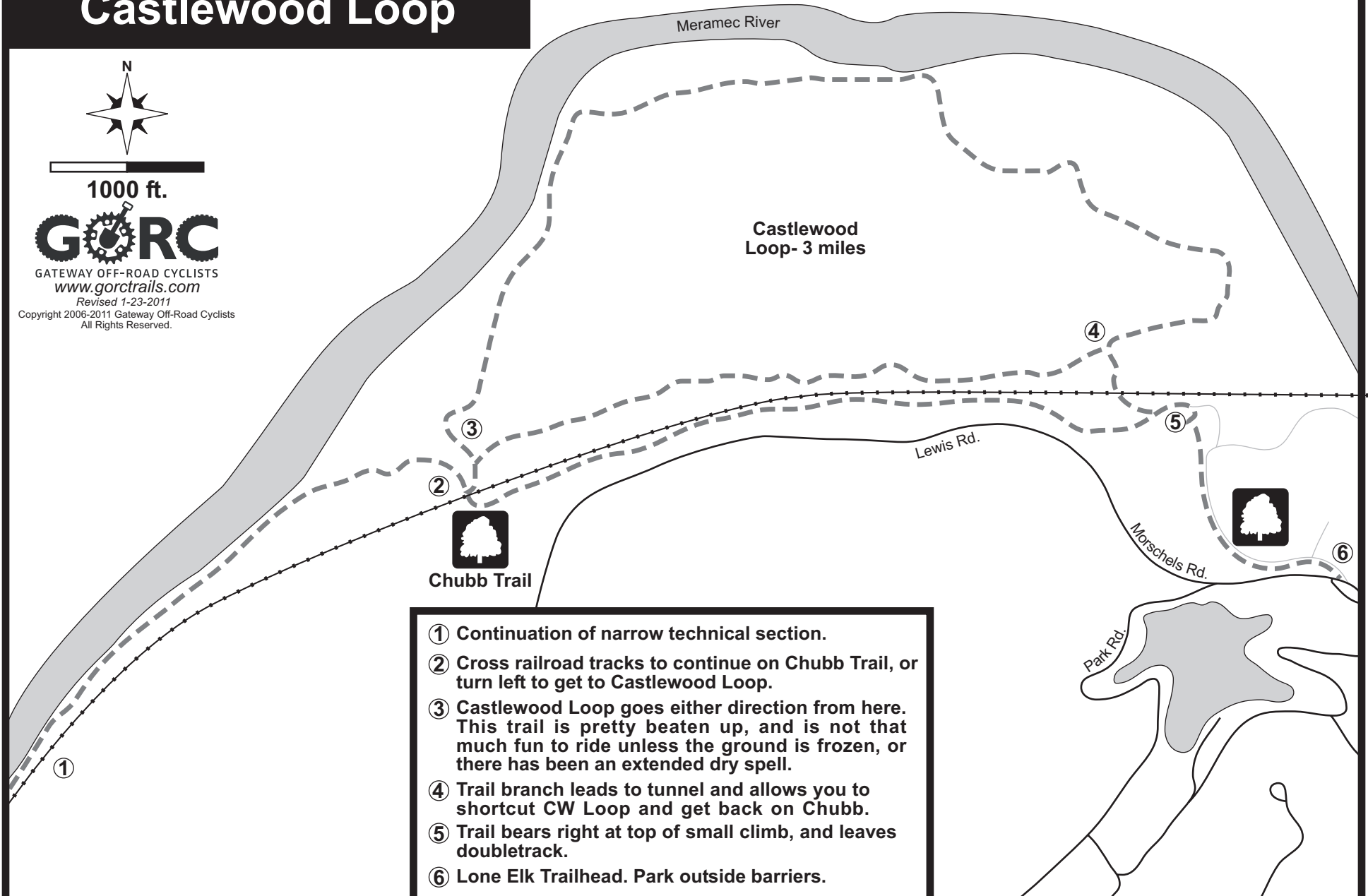
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- ① Continuation of narrow technical section.
- ② Cross railroad tracks to continue on Chubb Trail, or turn left to get to Castlewood Loop.
- ③ Castlewood Loop goes either direction from here. This trail is pretty beaten up, and is not that much fun to ride unless the ground is frozen, or there has been an extended dry spell.
- ④ Trail branch leads to tunnel and allows you to shortcut CW Loop and get back on Chubb.
- ⑤ Trail bears right at top of small climb, and leaves doubletrack.
- ⑥ Lone Elk Trailhead. Park outside barriers.
